The South Alabama men's basketball team wrapped up its regular season by winning two of its final three games over the last two weeks.

ULM 75, USA 57

On Thursday Feb. 26, the Jaguars fell to Louisiana-Monroe 75-57, after allowing the Warhawks to grab 19 offensive rebounds.

"We talked about being physical, being aggressive and boxing out," said South Alabama head coach Matthew Graves. "Obviously, the message didn't get through. When you give up 19 offensive rebounds, they got back almost half of their shots. That's a recipe for disaster."

Ken Williams scored 21 points during the loss, leading all scorers. He shot 6-of-9 overall and 4-of-6 from deep. Williams also had 3 rebounds and 5 turnovers.

"He was very efficient shooting

the basketball," Graves said of Williams. "Obviously you would like to have back some of those turnovers. You can't fault him. He was trying to make plays and get in the paint and do some things. It just wasn't our night. Again, you have to credit ULM on their defense. They held us to 40 percent. It was a great effort by them."

John Brown finished with 9 points and 4 rebounds, while Dionte Ferguson had 7 points and 7 rebounds. Abdul Lewis had 6 points and 6 rebounds, and Taishaun Johnson recorded 5 points, 4 rebounds and 3 assists.

As a team, the Jags shot 38.8% from the field and 38.9% from three-point territory. The Warhawks (19-9, 13-4 Sun Belt Conference) shot 45.9% from the field and 40.0% from behind the arc.

USA 81, ASU 76

Last Thursday, the Jaguars held on to beat Arkansas State 81-76 in Jonesboro, Arkansas after leading by as many as 24 points in the second half.

South Alabama scored 8 of the last 11 points in the game to come away with the victory and secure a spot in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament.

Dionte Ferguson led the Jaguars with 20 points and added 5 rebounds. Taishaun Johnson added 17 points, 9 rebounds and 7 assists. Johnson's 17 points brought his season total up to 396, setting a USA single-season record for points scored by a freshman.

"I can't begin to say enough about how proud I am of this team and what they've accomplished," USA head coach Matthew Graves said. "They hung tough and made some tough plays in those last couple of minutes to secure the victory.

The Jaguars got off to a hot start, shooting 17-of-28 (60.7 percent) from the floor in the first half and building a 14-point lead at half-

time. The Red Wolves (11-17, 6-13) tried to mount a comeback late in the game, but Ken Williams put the game out of reach on two free throws with 10.4 seconds left in the game. Anthony Livingston led the Red Wolves with 22 points and 9 rebounds.

USA 96, Troy 93

On Saturday, South Alabama concluded its regular season with a 96-93 win over Troy at the Mitchell Center.

Three players had career days for the Jaguars: Ken Williams tied a career-high with 28 points, Barrington Stevens III set a new personal best with 19 points, and Dionte Ferguson tied a career best with 14 rebounds. Ferguson finished with his team-high fourth double-double of the year, scoring 19 points on 6-of-8 shooting.

USA (11-20, 9-11) used a 19-3 run in the second half to take its eighth win in the last nine games

against Troy (10-19, 5-15).

"I think we have a lot of confidence, and we have a lot of guys that can score the basketball," head coach Matthew Graves said. "Obviously Ken [Williams] stepped up and made a big '3' at Arkansas State on Thursday, and I like a guy that wants to take that big shot. He's not only taking that big shot, but he's making it. So he's playing with a lot of confidence and doing some really good things."

Troy's Musa Abdul-Aleem scored 37 points on 13-of-20 shooting, including 8-of-10 from three-point range, good enough for second in Mitchell Center history. Wesley Person added 25 points and John Walton III added 21 points.

South Alabama earned the No. 6 seed in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament and will play the No. 7 seed Arkansas-Little Rock Thursday at 7:30 p.m. The winner will face No. 3-seeded Louisiana-Monroe on Friday.



Lady Jags finish season with three straight losses

After getting a big win against Georgia Southern Saturday, Feb. 21, the South Alabama women's basketball team dropped its final three games of the regular season.

ULM 45, USA 38

On Thursday Feb. 26, the Jaguars fell to Louisiana-Monroe 45-38 at the Mitchell Center and shot just 14-of-62 (22.6 percent) from the field. After the first five minutes, the Lady Jags were down 9-2 and the team's three leading scorers, Breanna Hall, Rachel Cumbo and Marquita Daniels were all score-

"I was just disappointed in the way we shot the ball — if you're going to shoot 22 percent, you're going to have a tough time beating anybody," USA head coach Terry Fowler said. "This was one of the few games where we had a double-digit advantage in shot attempts than our opponent, but we didn't capitalize on those opportunities."

Daniels came to life at the start of the second half. Five minutes in, she hit two 3-pointers to give the Jags their first lead of the game, but ULM (11-15, 7-10 Sun Belt Conference) immediately responded with a 9-0 run to go up 33-27, and wouldn't relinquish the lead again.

ASU 70, USA 60

Last Thursday, the Lady Jags almost pulled out a win at Arkansas State, getting within three points on three different occasions in the second half, but ultimately losing

Breanna Hall led the Jaguars with 16 points and 4 assists, and Marquita Daniels added 13 points.

"We got in some early foul trouble," South Alabama head coach Terry Fowler said. "(Marquita) Daniels wasn't able to play a lot in the first half and our post players got in some early foul trouble, so we had to

play with some different line ups, but our kids fought and I'm really proud of what they did tonight. We had chances, but it came down to turnovers and some second chance opportunities. When we needed a clutch three, we just couldn't come up with it. I was proud of how scrappy we played though. Arkansas State is a championshipcaliber team and we were able to give them a challenge tonight."

Arkansas State's Jasmine Hunt led all players with 20 points and 11 rebounds. Aundrea Gamble contributed 18 points and 7 assists for the Red Wolves (20-9, 15-4).

Troy 86, USA 79

On Saturday, the Lady Jags led Troy by four points at halftime, but let the lead slip away and lost 86-79 on Senior Night.

Breanna Hall scored 14 points and grabbed 8 rebounds in her final game for the Jaguars. Hall became the first Jaguar to end her career shooting better than 80 percent on free throws (80.9 percent).



Marquita Daniels led all players with 33 points and added 6 rebounds and 5 assists. Chyna Ellis recorded her seventh doubledouble of the year with 10 points and 16 rebounds. Ellis also blocked three shots, and ended the season as USA's freshman blocks

Troy (20-9, 15-5) got 20 points and 7 rebounds from Ashley Beverly-Kelley, and 13 points and 16 rebounds from Ronita Gar-

The Lady Jags finished the season with a 5-24 overall record, and ranked last in the Sun Belt with a 2-18 conference record.

After trailing by three for the first six innings, the South Alabama baseball team scored six unanswered runs in the final three innings to secure a 6-3 victory against the Alabama State Hornets on February 24.

Left-hander Shane McKinley earned the win for the Jags, pitching 1 1/3 scoreless relief

"That was huge," said South Alabama head coach Mark Calvi. "The game did not look good for us through 21 outs. Our guys hung in there, and our pitchers competed like crazy. (Austin) Bembnowski was pretty good, not great, but the mark of a good pitcher is still giving your team a chance when you don't have your best stuff. Right-hander Ben Taylor earned his first win after pitching a single scoreless relief in-




The Jags concluded the weekend on a positive note: with an 8-5 win against the Ra-

The Jaguars started the week with a sweep of Florida A&M on Monday, March 2. In singles play, No. 1 Tim Srkala beat Karlyn Small 6-3, 5-7. On the No. 2 court, Daniel Leitner defeated Walner Espinoza 6-3, 6-3. At No. 3, Gerhard Gruindelingh took down Carlos Waitman 6-3, 6-2. On the No. 4 court, Tuki Jacobs topped Courage Okungbowa 6-1, 6-7, and at the No. 5 spot Juan Troglia took down Joel Ovonlen-Jones 1-6, 6-1, 6-3. "It feels good to get a 7-0 win," said USA head coach Nick Brochu. "Some guys still

struggled but closed the match in good fashion."
